
COVID SERIOUSLY?







AUID 2020 CONFERENCE RECAP









The conference was held over a 2-day period, October 6-7. We had 68 members join us for the sessions. While many of the CEUs provided great knowledge about higher education design, much of our networking, panel discussions, and round table discussions revolved around our experiences with COVID-19. Seeing the knowledge shared in a time of unknowns and figuring it out together, AUID virtual conference proved to be unique but highly valuable event.

We kicked off the conference with the business meeting where members were given updates about the organization's past year and plans for the following year. Abigail Koster My name is Abigail Koster, but I typically go by Abbie. I am from Northwest Indiana and I




